



Memories of Selhurst by Tony Massey (1947-1950)

I was at Selhurst Grammar School from 1947 to 1950. I was in the 6th form studying French, German, English and Latin for the A level exams. The teachers were Mr Wedd for French, Mr Oakley for German (I was the only student) , Mr Egford for English and Mr Scott for Latin. I played in the school's rugby team all 3 years and was a house captain for 2 years. In 1948 Mr Wedd asked me if I would accept an exchange with a French boy for a term. I was to go to Saintes in France and live with the boy's family and attend the local lycée. In return the boy would stay with my family in Croydon for a similar period. I agreed and greatly improved my oral and written French. I won a state scholarship in the A level exam with a place at London University. In August 1950 I was called up for National Service and was sent for basic training to the Rifle Brigade (Green Jackets) barracks in Winchester. While there I realised that going to London University would mean a daily commute to and from Croydon. So I sent off applications to Oxford and Cambridge.

Much to my surprise I received an immediate reply from Queens' College, Cambridge and a request to go for an interview. I was accepted to read French and German. After graduation, I found a job teaching at a private school in Ontario, Canada. I found I liked teaching and applied to do a Master's degree in French and Education at Yale. I was able to obtain a Ford Foundation Fellowship which covered all my expenses in return for a few hours a week as an assistant in the French department. After Yale I went back to Ontario and taught briefly in Toronto schools. I then went to Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario as a professor of language education. At the same time I completed my PH.D in French applied linguistics and did research into Canadian French immersion teaching. I am now retired as a professor emeritus.

Friends I remember from Selhurst are John Brian Williamson (captain of the rugby team, played for England under-19 team and was head boy at Selhurst), Ronin (or was it Colin?) Chapman who also went to Cambridge University and Geoff Shackleton who played in the rugby team. I enjoyed my years at Selhurst and know that my teachers and friends changed my life in many good ways.
