

THE OLD CROYDONIANS' ASSOCIATION ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2021 : REPORTS (BY EMAIL/POST)

1. TREASURER'S REPORT (ACCOUNTS AT END OF DOCUMENT)

The accounts for the year ended 30 April 2021 show a surplus of £1,821 which when added to the accumulated surplus brought forward of £2,480 gives an accumulated surplus to carry forward of £4,301.

The main reason for the surplus of £1,821 is the very generous donations received of £1,743 without which the surplus would have been £78. As there were no meetings held during the year due to coronavirus, there was also a saving on expenses.

The donation paid of £200 was in respect of the leavers at The Crescent Primary School.

The Association requires funds at the end of the accounting year in order to pay the magazine costs and postage in June, which is prior to new subscription income from September. This year the cost has been £2,605, leaving a balance of funds at present of £1,696.

A forecast has been prepared through to 2025-26 which shows that without an increase in fees the Association would be short of. funds in the next couple of years.

The Sustaining membership fee has remained at £12 for the last 5 years. It is recommended that the fee is increased to £17 and to keep it at this level until 2025-26. This is an increase of 50p per year over 10 years.

By the end of June 2021 we have 437 members, of these 316 are Old Boys and 121 Old Girls. Although this shows a reduction of 24 from the same time last year the numbers of sustaining member has risen to 259 from 236 last year. Since January 2021, 7 new members have joined us, 2 of whom are Old Girls.

3. EDITOR'S REPORT

- 1. The 2021 Old Croydonian magazine was distributed to 249 sustaining members, including 19 overseas members, at the beginning of June. So far, feedback has been very positive. A few complimentary copies are being sent to the families of those members who have passed away and who have submitted obituaries. Croydon Archives will also receive a copy.
- 2. Sadly, we still have nearly 200 non-sustaining members who do not receive the magazine.
- 3. The 2021 magazine was an exceptional 100-page issue split into two volumes since the stronger binding required would have incurred an extra cost.
- 4. The main theme of the issue was the 60th anniversary of the Lanfranc School tragedy in Norway in 1961. We are incredibly grateful to OC member and former BBC journalist, Neil Bennett, for researching and contributing the article. We have produced an extract of the article and photo sheet for the Lanfranc Academy and other interested non-Selhurst people, with a foreword by Cortland setting the scene and the background to the OCA.
- 5. The editorial team of Valerie, Roger, Brian, Steve Coltman and Mike Roberts in Canada worked well together to produce the magazine. Mike has undertaken a project to produce a database of all the photos contained in the magazines and on the website for quick reference purposes.
- 6. We are not short of contributions for 2022 and already have several lined up. Articles from girls are particularly needed.
- 7. The 2020 Autumn Newsletter was issued last September and the one for 2021 is due out this September.

5. WEBMASTER'S REPORT


